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CREATIVE RESPONSE

Read Psalm 51.

Consider dividing up the reading as follows:

- Reader 1: verses 1-2;
- Reader 2: verses 3-5;
- Reader 3: verses 6-9;
- Reader 4: verses 10-12.

At the end of each section, invite all household members to respond together with these words: "God, create a pure heart in me."

ACTION RESPONSE

Plant and water flower seeds in pots with potting soil.

Plan to give the flower pots away as Easter gifts to friends or neighbours as a sign of the new life that has come through the death and resurrection of Jesus. Write on the pot "John 12:24" and decorate it with Easter symbols.
